To promote diversity, a maximum of two contributions from the same research group will be permitted. Proposals should also aim for broad international representation, including participants from different continents.

Mini-symposium proposals will be reviewed independently and prior to regular submissions. Acceptance or rejection will apply to the mini-symposium as a whole, based on the overall quality and coherence of the proposed contributions.

In addition to the tentative speakers listed above, the ICCFD Board may invite further contributions to the mini-symposium.
